So technically, with this plan, you have two different ways that you can get coverage for prescriptions. You can get coverage through Elixir, which I believe the coverage that you get with that is typically for preventative medications. Um, and then you have the FreeRx subscri- subscription, of course, which FreeRx, um, covers, uh, you know, anything between, like, uh, chronic and acute medications. The majority of the medications with FreeRx are free. If it's not free, it would be discounted. Um, now with FreeRx, I know only certain medications, typically chronic medications are only available for home delivery, and then other medications, like acute, would be available for pharmacy pickup. Hmm. I don't know what would... blood pressure fall under that? Probably acute, I would think, but... I'm not too sure myself, just because we're-Yeah. Uh-huh. ... your Benefits Administers, but, um, you can go onto the FreeRx website, which is just freerx.com. There's a way that you can do a drug search and it will pull up the medication. If it's covered, um, it'll show you either \$0, which means free, or if it's discounted, it'll tell you, like, how much is covered. And then it'll tell you if it's a pharmacy pickup or home

delivery. So, so probably be better just to do the, the VIP then. But that doesn't have a lecture but it has more pharmacy stuff, is what I'm seeing then?
